

Following the granting of a €45k Sports Capital Grant works will commence in October to construct new tee boxes on the 4th/6th/7th/8th holes and a winter tee box for the 9th hole positioned at the back of the 8th green. The club will be committing €7k towards this project bringing the total expenditure to €52k. The works will also include drainage work on the 16th/17th fairways.
